NEXT LIBRARY PRESENTATION - JUNE – AARHUS, DENMARK

EEF sponsored Prof. Wang Zizhou from Peking University to present his research and field work he has done for the rural libraries in China at the Next Library conference in Aarhus, Denmark. In the discussions after Prof. Wang's talk, a Colombian librarian mentioned the presentation shed some light on similar issues that he had encountered in some rural libraries in his country.

A French librarian expressed her interest in the big community of left-behind children and elders as the target group of grass root libraries; she said that although she learned of the development of Chinese urban libraries through other conferences, this talk provided her with an opportunity to see efforts to address the needs of rural libraries, and provided her with a reference for her future visit to and exchange with China.



SUMMER EXCHANGE PROGRAM – AUGUST – HUBEI, CHINA

The goal of summer US-China student exchange program is to enhance mutual understanding of student life in their respective countries. Building on the online Skype program in 2018, the program was a great success in inspiring the students' curiosity about the outside world. US 9th grade student, Victor Laczay wanted to see the real life of kids in rural China. In summer 2019, he made a trip to China where he stayed with other kids for several days. Also he participated in students' daily activities and visited two students' homes and became friends with a student named Can Yu, which was a very different experience than he has ever had. Victor finally got to experience what his mother described about growing up in China. "I will visit them again and invite them to US in the future," Victor said on his way back home.
